Scholarship


The chapter provides \$10,000 research grants annually to support members doing research to advance nursing science and scholarship. Examples of projects funded in 2017:

- Adherence to hypertension self-management behaviors through mindfulness \$5,000
- ☐ Comparison of local anesthetics for intravenous catheter insertion in hospitalized pediatric patients \$2,000
- Information continuity in the pediatric intensive care unit \$2,000
- ☐ Effect of RN implicit bias on pain outcomes in the emergency department \$1,000

- □ Volunteer opportunities: Encourages member involvement with international volunteer groups and committees such as the Odyssey conference planning committee and International Taskforce


Networking Opportunities for New Inductees
