
What is Academic Dishonesty?

- A violation of academic integrity (Park et al., 2013)
- Influencing Factors



Classroom Exams and Plagiarism – Faculty Recommendations

- Limit faculty access to exam
- Multiple test versions
- Change questions each semester
- Do not administer the same exam on different days
- Use additional faculty when available
- No personal belongings during exams
- Assigned seating
- Submit assignments electronically
- Vary course writing assignments


