Snapshot of partnership

- Partnership for BSN program b/w Newberry
 College & Lexington Medical Center signed 2006
- Components of partnership NC: hire faculty; curriculum, approval, & accreditation; clinical simulation labs; fundraising; LMC: provide MSN-prepared clinical instructors; scholarships & loans to NC students; start money
- Outcomes graduated 10 classes; CCNEvaccredited; 45-50% graduates employed at LMC

Components of successful partnership

- Identifying need & goal(s)
- Finding the best fit
- Clarifying roles of each partner
- Formalizing the collaboration
- Implementing the partnership
- Reaching the goals
- Renewing/revising the partnership

Outcomes of the community partnership

- Win/win perspectives increased % BSN staff;
 EBP/research projects; internal consistency within curriculum, especially clinical courses; clinical staff more engaged w/student learning; smoother transition to practice; practicum site for MSN education students; alumni transitioned to faculty
 - Challenges for each partner expenses including time; education about other partner(s)

Suggestions for future collaborations:

- Include clinical partners in curriculum decisions
- Bring experienced nursing faculty on board early
- Don't assume that something that works at one school automatically will be successful at another
- Adhere to boundaries/preset standards
- Collect data on all segments of partnership & assess effectiveness each time a change is made
 - Document history of partnership as it occurs
