What is a Chapter Charter Amendment

- Process of changing a chapter's structure
- Sigma's most common charter amendment applications include:
 - Adding an institution of higher education and/or practice setting to become an at-Large chapter
 - Merging two chapters together
 - Dividing an at-Large chapter into smaller chapters

66 To amend is to change something. >>

Eligibility for Adding Institutions of Higher Education & Practice Settings to a Chapter

Adding Institution of Higher Education

- Must be appropriately accredited
- Offers a minimum of a BSN degree or higher
- Has own Dean or equivalent
- Has support from university administration and head of school of nursing

Adding Practice Setting

- Must be appropriately accredited
- Employs professional nurses with a BSN or higher
- Has own CNO or equivalent
- Has support from practice setting administration and CNO

Definition of a Practice Setting

A clinical practice setting is where care is provided by a registered nurse. Clinical practice requires the delivery of health care services by a registered nurse to individuals and communities.

This may include:

- Healthcare systems
- Hospitals
- Clinics
- Surgery Centers
- Nursing Care Centers




Definition of a Practice Setting

- Must have a Chief Nursing Officer

The leadership of the CNO constitutes how larger organizations with multiple locations will be considered

- Ex: Johns Hopkins Medicine
 - 5 hospitals that each have their own CNO
 - Each is considered as 1 practice setting
 - Chapter amended by adding 5 practice settings, even though all are under the Johns Hopkins Hospital System umbrella
- What about the satellite clinics, rehab facilities, doctor's offices, etc.?
 - All additional, smaller locations that do not have their own CNO (but rather share a CNO from one of the 5 hospitals) would be considered part of the larger practice setting of the CNO who oversees the nurses in that location.

Definition of a Practice Setting



Limitations of the Practice Setting

- Cannot start their own, stand alone chapter
- Cannot start an at-large with only practice settings
- Cannot divide from chapter on their own to become a stand alone chapter
- Cannot join multiple chapters



Ways to Amend a Chapter

- Chapter + 1 or more schools

- Chapter + 1 or more practice settings

Additional Requirements for Application

- Ongoing consultations and contact with Sigma staff throughout amendment process
- Discussions to assess interest and commitment
- Chapter Board Vote documented in meeting minutes
- Chapter Membership Vote with documentation
- Letters of Support from all existing chapter's institutions of higher education and/or practice settings (administration and head of nursing)
- Letters of Support from all joining practice setting(s) (administration and CNO)
- Examples/samples of collaboration, inclusion, integration, communication, and promotion
- Draft of Proposed at-Large Chapter Bylaws



Completion & Submission of Charter Amendment Application

Online Application Portal

- Structured process for completing required tasks
- Frequent, regular direction from staff
- Application is completed as you complete required tasks within electronic portal

Application process

- Partnership and Collaboration: 6 months or more
- Finalizing Application and Submission: 2-4 weeks recommended
- Staff Processing of Application: 2 weeks
- Reviewers (2) from the CRTF: 4-6 weeks
- Charter Review Task Force group vote: 2 weeks
- Sigma Governance Committee vote: 2 weeks
- Sigma Board of Directors vote: 4-6 weeks

Charter Amendment Ceremony Planning


- Planning of Ceremony: 12 weeks

- Someone from the chapter or someone from the PS?




- Why did the chapter want to partner with a practice setting?

- One counselor is <u>required</u> from each SON or PS
 within an at-large chapter
 (Counselor to represent PS is not required to be
 faculty or hold any certain position at the PS)
- One vice president is <u>recommended</u> to represent each group in addition to counselor



How did you address the logistics of:

- Chapter Programs & Events

- Will student members want to travel away from campus?
- Will members working outside of the university want to travel to campus?
- Will events be rotated between locations?
- Will these take place at different times of the day to accommodate nurses who may be working night or weekend shifts?
- How will the events be planned at different locations?

- Chapter Finances

- How does the group handle finances for events at each location?
- Will there be more than one team planning events?
