The Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) were a set of measurable goals that strove to reduce extreme poverty in developing countries. The 8 Goals includes 21 targets and 60 indicators



### SDGS (2015-2030)

The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) are a set of qualitative objectives across the social, economic, and environmental dimensions. They are universal in nature and include 17 Goals with 169 Targets and 231 Indicators.


### WHY IS SIGMA AT THE UNITED NATIONS?

## GLOBAL CITIZENSHIP EDUCATION OBJECTIVES


- To acquire knowledge, understanding, and critical thinking about the interconnectedness and interdependency of different countries and populations, including educational, political, economic, social and environmental issues
