Introduction

- There is an emergent need for nursing professionals to acquire extensive education on disaster preparedness and situations.
- Nursing professionals are increasingly faced with disaster situations that are natural and man-made, locally, nationally and globally.
- According to the Centre for Research on the Epidemiology of Disasters (CRED) (2019),
 there were 315 natural disaster events worldwide in 2018.
- There were 11,804 deaths and over 68 million people affected worldwide by natural disasters in 2018.
- According to Swiss Re Institute (2019) the United States in 2018 had 123 man-made disasters.
- From 1980 to 2018, there have been approximately 300 to 400 disasters each year, both man-made and natural, around the world. This amount has been constant.

- NR 804- Clinical Prevention and Population Health with a Focus on the Epidemiology of Infectious Diseases and Public Health Threats has a direct focus on epidemiological theories and diseases as it applies to population health and disaster preparedness.
- NR 808- Systems Approach to Disaster Preparedness at Home and Abroad focuses on the leadership role of the DNP in natural and man-made disasters. 100 clinical hours are devoted to disaster preparedness and disaster scenario. Students receive FEMA certification.
- NR 810- Promoting Health, Healing and Hope in Response to a Chaotic Human Condition: Trauma, Traumatic Stress Assessment and Treatment prepares the student for psychosocial intervention in the field of disaster response and traumatic stress intervention.
- NR 812- Global Health Nursing Practice and Policy Development the student learns to respond in a leadership and collaborating role with other professionals in the healthcare field to respond to global health needs and disaster situations nationally and abroad. 100 clinical hours are dedicated to global health.
