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### **Background**

- Peer mentorship is an untapped resource in global clinical nursing programs
- Students face distinct challenges from language barriers to navigating cross-cultural differences<sup>6</sup>
- Columbia University School of Nursing's Office of Global Initiatives (OGI) has a rigorous global clinical placement program that has sent:

## **Objective**



# Advantages Challenges

- Usefulness of integration site guide for local connections and packing list.
- Ease with in country connections with prior student contacts
- Ability to use document in little or no wifi access areas.

- Inability to email about specific challenges in country due to wifi
- More face-to-face time with peer-mentors
- Pieces of integration document outdated
- Willingness of future students to update document

### Conclusion

- There is a benefit to peer involvement in global nursing integration programs.
- An integration site guide is the most sustainable form of involvement due to the aforementioned constraints

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
