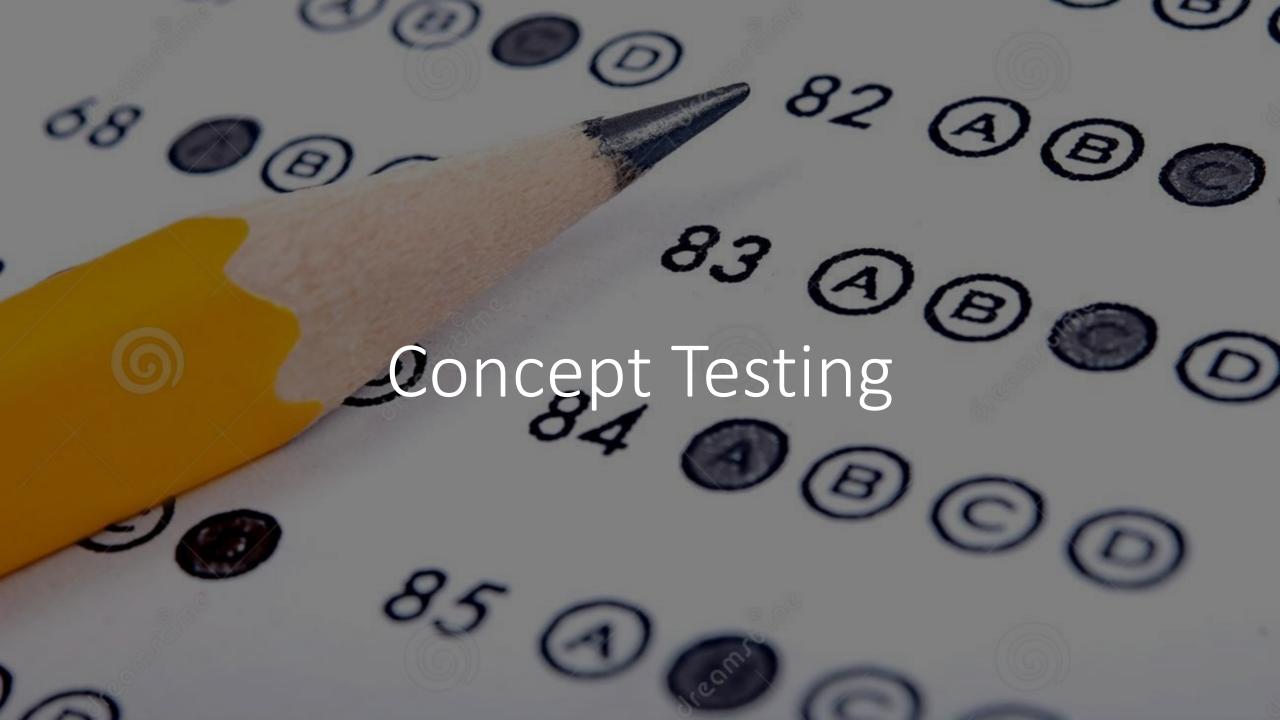

### Context for Intervention

- A three-credit, Health Promotion Theories and Population-Focused Interventions course for students in a doctor of nursing practice program.
- Hybrid course= two in-person sessions + online asynchronous format.
- Five modules over sixteen-week semester



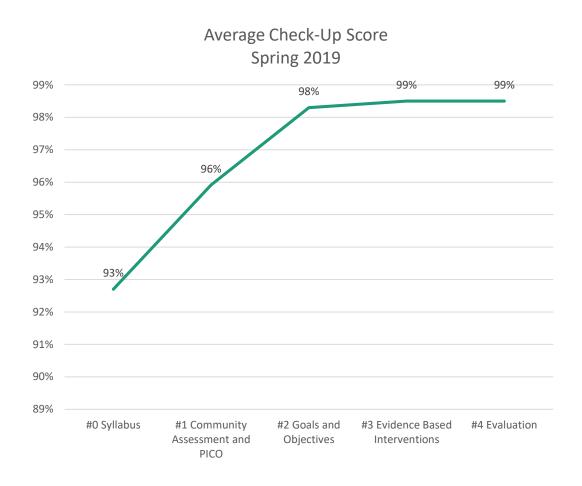
## Intervention: CHECK-UP



- Each module included a Check-Up
- 10-12 questions
- 2.5% of total course grade
- Open for a week
- No time limit
- Three attempts

# Sample student feedback about implementation of Check-Up

- "You should not change the check-ups, they are helpful and the grading set up takes some pressure off the "having to get an A" feeling when taking the assessment, allowing more learning, I believe."
- "At the beginning of the semester, I was overwhelmed with the check-ups, the discussion board posts, and the windshield surveys. We had something due almost every week and by the end of the semester, we only had a few assignments due so I constantly worried that I was forgetting something when I was not...To me, the check-ups did not provide a lot of additional help."

# Moving Forward



Reduce the number of allowed attempts (from three to two)



Move from multiple choice questions to application-based questions



How those key concepts connect to the big picture in the checkups



Consider where check-ups are introduced in the modules
