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
Objectives

- lecturers and students
 evaluated the experience.

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
RESULTS (1) Number of Participants



182 students - divided into 17 groups

18 lecturers





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RESULTS (2) Students' evaluation

The students' evaluations showed:

- Interest and satisfaction;
- Links with professional practice;
- The need for more in-depth analysis.



RESULTS (3)

Faculties' evaluation

The faculties' feedback underline:

- Consistency between skills, objectives and content;
- Coherence between content and professional practice;
- Links with other learning units in the training pathway;
- Appropriate didactical choices;
- Good level of student interest/participation.



Discussion

- Although the pandemic influenced the preliminary choices the students' evaluations were most positive.
- A high coherence between competences, objectives, contents and their link to professional practice as well as an adequate choice of didactic methods were highlighted by the lecturers as fundamental to the achievement of the defined objectives.
- The adapted learning unit allowed an excellent interaction between students, enhancing mutual understanding and appreciation of different professional perspectives.
