

Sendafa, Ethiopia on the East Coast of



- Population 84,000,000 (2.6% annual growth rate)
- Size 435,186 sq.mi. (Texas + Oklahoma)
- Average income \$100/yr
- Life expectancy (from birth) in 2011- 56 yo
 (US- 78)
- Physicians/100,000 population- 2.9 (US=549)
- AIDS prevalence 4.4-7% (12.6%urban, 2,6%rural)
- Infant mortality rate in 2011- 77/1000 live births (US= 6.63)

- We started there in 2006

 - 1 Dentist
 - 7 Nurses (1 Ethiopian)
 - 1 Pharmacist + 2 pharmacy techs (Ethiopian)
- Nonmedical team
 - 17 who worked in the schools, did construction, HIV/AIDS home visit
 - 30 Interpreters, helpers (Ethiopian)



Statistics

- 1 week medical clinic
- 50% of the cases are due to contaminated food and water
- Glasses 500-600 pair per year
- Cataract surgeries 40-50 per year
- General surgery 25-35 per year
- Dentistry 65-75 per year

HIV patients

- Started with about a dozen
- Now >300 people mostly women
- No doctor in the village...people shunned
- Now medication is available to the people of Sendafa
- One HIV positive woman with 2 sons who are still HIV NEGATIVE



Diarrheal Diseases

- Accounts for 46% of mortality for children under 5 years old
- Contaminated food and water
 - Fecal oral transmission
- Incidence rates of 5.5 to 8 or more episodes of diarrhea per child per year
- Viruses, bacteria, protozoa



Iodine Deficiency

- Goiter rate 23% tip of iceberg
- Households with iodized salt- 19%
- Hypothyroidism
- Cretinism
- Mental retardation-
 - Average loss of 10-15 I Q points from iodine deficiency alone
 - Not reversible
- Increases neonatal and infant mortality



- Goiter
- Keratitis due to cooking over open flame indoors
- Cataracts
- Rashes
- Tuberculosis
- Fatty tumors
- Leprosy
