Phenomena of Concern

- Influx of Latino immigrants has dramatically increased in recent decades, bringing challenges in several areas including health issues
- Deficiency in quantitative studies regarding Latino immigrant experience
- Importance of understanding the Latino immigrant perspective

Purpose of the Study

The purpose of this study was to give voice to Latino immigrant families

Method

- Interpretive Phenomenology
- Instrumentation
- Sample information
- Data Collection and Recording

Data Analysis

- Thematic analysis
- Data trustworthiness established
- Heideggerian hermeneutics
- Heideggerian philosophy

Interview Probes

Initial

- Tell me about a time when you needed to find vaccinations for your child
- o How is it that vaccinations affect your health?
- Tell me about vaccinations in your home country
- o How is it that vaccinations are or are not beneficial?

Amended/expanded

- Tell me about a good experience with health care services
- o Tell me about a time you were frustrated with health care services
- o How did you find out about a place for health care?
- o Has there been someone who helped you a lot?
- o Do you have a usual place for health care?
- o What can nurses do to improve your experience?

Results of Study

- Overarching Theme
 - o Trust
- Subthemes
 - Health literacy
 - Health disparities
 - The medical home
 - Preserving the family unit

Overarching Theme

- Trust
 - Self trust
 - Trust in health care providers
 - Trust in health care facility
 - Heidegger interpretation

Trust Issues

- Revaccination in spite of documentation
 - Linda "I brought it (vaccination document) but they said (health provider) it was a requirement to vaccinate them again"
- Inconsistent practices among vaccination sites
 - Juan: "We presented the records to them, and they (health provider)
 made a new record, including all the vaccinations he already had and
 the ones that he needed"
- Cultural values being treated with kindness
 - Carmen "If they treat you well, they're cordial, they give you that trust that allows you to be calm and to believe that they're going to tend to you better"
