


Delta Phi Background





Academic and practice partnerships shared mutual benefits for both organizations involved (Berry 2011).

American Association of Colleges of Nursing (AACN) recognized the importance of academic and practice partnerships to enhance student learning and patient outcomes (AACN, 2010).

Riley, Beal, Levi and McCausalnd (2002) reported scholarly activity does not reside "uniquely in academic settings" nor is the pursuit of scholarship the "exclusive domain of nursing faculty" (p. 383).

Urriololagoitia and Planellas (2007) stated corporate sponsorships encouraged strategic alliances for ongoing relationships.

In an attempt to promote scholarship among practicing nurses, the Delta Phi Chapter reached out to established academic and practice partnerships.
