








Other issues to think about

- Substantive editing
- Under-reporting- "Faculty members who ignore or trivialise academic dishonesty send the message that the core values of academic life aren't worth enforcing" (McCabe & Pavela, 2004, p 15).
- New forms adapting all the time (Dadkhah, 2015)
- Cyber fraud- fraudulent journals, invalid conferences, forced joint authorship, predatory publishing, hijacked journals, bogus impact factors and so on...
