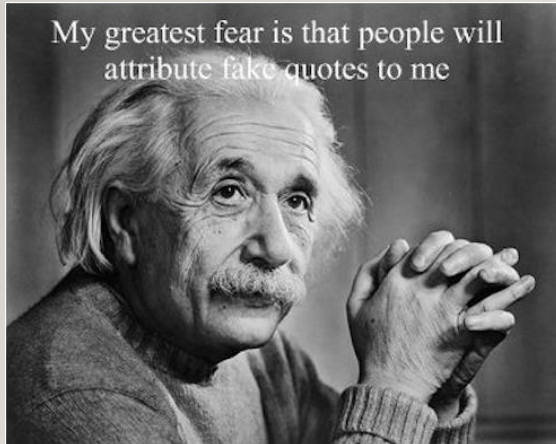

SEARCHING ARTICLE DATABASES: GENERAL SEARCH STRATEGY*

- Create a search statement using keywords.
 - Use bibliographic databases appropriate to your topic.
 - Use keywords and controlled language.
 - Use Boolean searching (truncation, wildcards, adjacency searching)
-
- Citation searching – use the references from on-point articles,
 - Change approaches as necessary – gathering information is not a linear process,
 - Continue to identify applicable keywords and controlled vocabulary.

SEARCH STATEMENT:

- Identify methods for creating a **healthy work environment** within my **hospital** to increase nurse **job satisfaction** and **retention rates**.

SEARCHING DATABASES:

- Boolean operators – connect and define relationship between your search terms.
 - AND, OR, and NOT
 - Example: “work environment” AND “occupational health”
 - Example: “work environment” AND creating
 - Example: “work environment” AND creating NOT union
- Truncation – using a character (usually an asterisk *) to search for variant forms of a word.

SEARCHING DATABASES:

KEYWORDS

- Familiar words used by a profession to describe a concept
- Many keywords and phrases may describe the same concept
- Straightforward and comfortable
- Not always efficient

CONTROLLED VOCABULARY

- Predetermined words or phrases for groups of keywords or key phrases
- Eliminates thinking of and searching for synonyms – more efficient, eliminates guesswork
- Requires consistency amongst catalogers and indexers within a repository/database and between repositories/databases

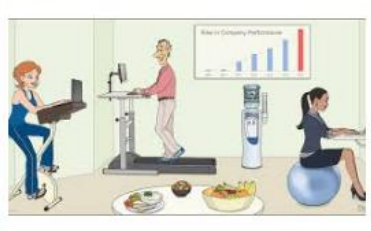

Bullying has been identified as one of the leading workplace stressors, with adverse consequences for the individual employee, groups of employees, and whole organisations. Employees who have been bullied have lower levels of job satisfaction, higher levels of anxiety and depression, and are more likely to leave their place of work. Organisations face increased risk of skill depletion and absenteeism, leading to loss of profit, potential legal fees, and tribunal cases. It is unclear to what extent these risks can be addressed through interventions to prevent bullying.

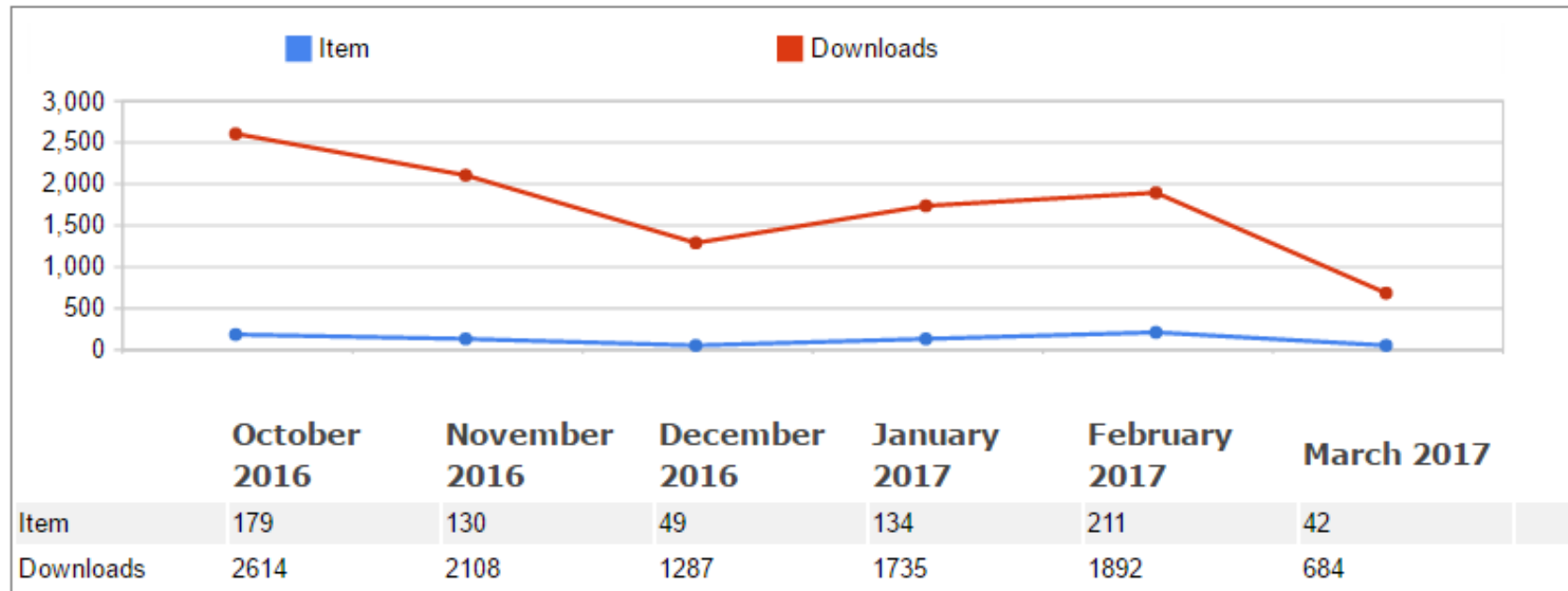

Total Visits per Month (Last Six Months)




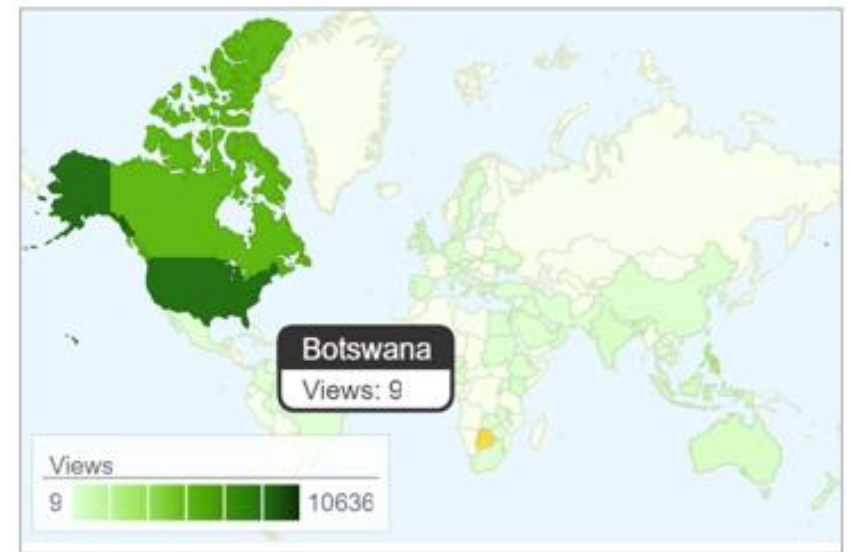
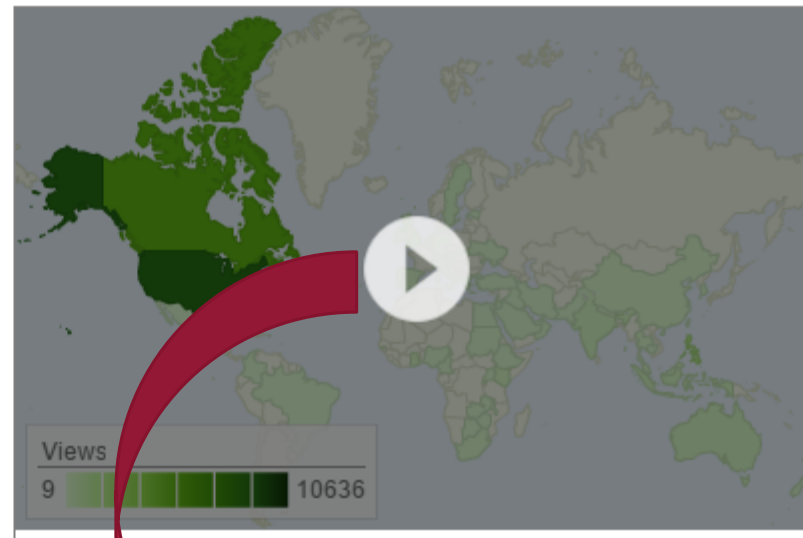

ALTMETRICs

alt + metrics

Complementary to traditional citation metrics

Score is an indicator. Underlying qualitative data tells you who's saying what about your research.

Altmetric tracks attention to scholarly and clinical outputs across peer reviews, news, Wikipedia citations, policy documents, research blogs, bookmarks on reference managers like Mendeley, and mentions on Facebook and Twitter.



WHY ALTMETRICS?

1. Deliver real-time, immediate feedback on attention to scholarly and clinical content.
2. Track attention to a broad range of research, educational, and EPB outputs, e.g. ,articles, posters, data sets, working papers
3. Showcase attention to research, educational, and EBP materials beyond academia
4. Provide a more coherent understanding of research attention
