LEARNING OBJECTIVES	EXPANDED CONTENT OUTLINE
The learner will be able to describe the associations between nurses' perceived knowledge of KPC infection control, personal experience of working in KPC isolation room, professional functioning and their job satisfaction.	Nurses were more satisfied with their job when their perceived knowledge of infection control was better, their personal experience of working in KPC isolation rooms was more positive, and they perceived their professional functioning as more effective and productive.
The learner will be able to identify the relationships between nurses' sense of loneliness, their professional functioning and their experience of working with a KPC-infected patient in isolation room.	The higher the nurses' sense of loneliness the poorer their experience of working with a KPC cohort and the poorer their self-reported professional functioning on the ward.
The learner will be able to report factors that partially explain the variance in job satisfaction of nurses working in KPC isolation room.	Personal experience of working in KPC-source isolation rooms and perceived level of professional functioning on the ward predicted the dependent variable, explaining 33% of the variance in nurses' job satisfaction.
