The learner will be able to describe motivations for undergoing a living kidney donation among practitioners in the fields of nursing and social work.	The content will describe what motivates an individual to undergo living kidney donation surgery.
The learner will be able to articulate the relationship between material incentives, social distance and motivation to donate a kidney.	The content will describe the relationship between material incentives, social distance, and donor motivation.
The learner will be able to relate various material rewards to willingness to donate.	Examples of the levels of compensation available to donors will be described as well as the differences between social workers and nurses in their level of agreement about the various material rewards.
The learner will be able to describe the correlation between willingness to donate a kidney to close or distant others and certain material rewards.	The content will demonstrate a statistical examination of the correlations between social distance and support for material incentives when a living kidney is donated.
The learner will be able to define compassion fatigue among nurses and social workers as it relates to motivation to becoming a living kidney donor.	The content will explain the self-ratings concerning compassion fatigue and worker burnout as possible factors influencing donor motivations among nursing and social work professionals.
