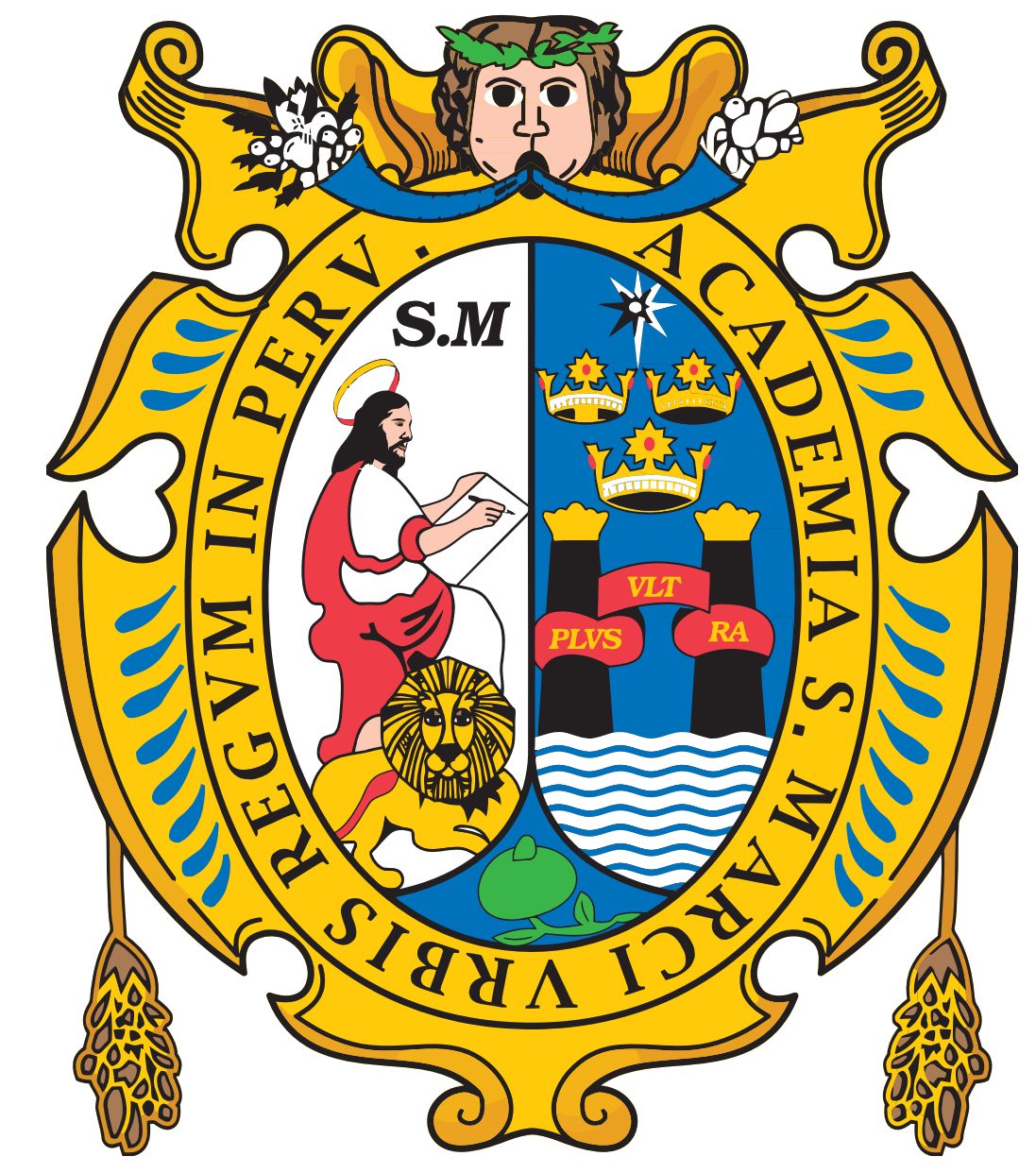

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COMPARISON OF NEGATIVE STEREOTYPES TO AGING IN STUDENTS OF LICENSING IN NURSING OF SALTILLO, MEXICO AND LIMA PERU.

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PURPOSE

To compare the presence of negative stereotypes towards aging and its relationship with socio-demographic variables and coexistence with older adults in nursing undergraduate students from Saltillo Coahuila and Lima, Peru.

METHODS

| Descriptive-comparative and correlational. | A stratified random sample will be taken with proportional affixation by gender. This sample size will have associated a 95% confidence and a 5% error, based on the calculation on finite populations. | A certificate of socio-demographic data, certificate of coexistence with older adult and Questionnaire of negative stereotypes towards the aging (Cronbach's Alpha 0.845). |



ANALYSIS OF DATA

Descriptive statistics will be used to characterize the sample. The Kolmogorov-Smirnov Adjustment Goodness Test will be performed with Lilliefors correction to test the hypothesis of normality in the distribution of the continuous variables considered as significant with a value $p < 0.05$. In case of normality, Student's t-test will be used for independent samples. If there is no normality, nonparametric tests will be used to test the Mann Whitney U test.

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
