

Asthma

- Chronic
- Remitting and Exacerbating
- Coughing
- Wheezing
- Chest tightness
- Shortness of breath
- Cannot be cured, but can be controlled





Childhood Asthma

- Childhood asthma is a growing health concern:
 - Most common chronic illness of childhood
 - Leading cause of ER visits, hospitalizations, school absenteeism

Goal of asthma management

- Increased symptom free days
- Increased QoL
- Prevention of lung damage



Future Time Perspective

- The degree to which an individual's temporal perspective of time (past, present and future) guides their behaviors¹
- The motivation behind one's actions based on the consideration of future goals, present events, or past events²

Future Time Perspective

- Originates from Theory of Relativity
 - Establishes the subjective nature of physical time
- Lewin Life Space Model
 - Totality of a person's views on psychological future and past existing at the same moment
- Integrates past and future into right now
- Basic premise
 - Individual's perspective of time influences behavior

Scoping Review

- Developed by Arksey & O'Malley
- AKA "scoping study"
- Increasingly popular approach to review evidence
- "A process of summarizing a range of evidence in order to convey the breadth and depth of a field"
- Quality of data not assessed (as with systematic reviews)

Scoping Review

- Six stages of scoping review
 - 1. Identify broad research question
 - 2. Identify relevant studies
 - 3. Study selection
 - 4. Chart data
 - 5. Collate and summarize results
 - 6. Consultation (optional)



Significance

- Treatment non-adherence leads to poor asthma control and increased severity
- FTP influences health behaviors

Purpose

 Synthesize existing knowledge regarding adolescent asthma self-management and FTP to inform nursing practice and identify knowledge gaps

Research Question

Methods

- Study selection
 - 6 search terms
 - 28 articles
- Data chart
 - 9 categories
- Data Synthesis

Results

- FTP influences patients decisions to engage in healthy behaviors
 - Study of adolescents (13-18y) perceive better life opportunities, less likely to engage in risky health behaviors
- Paucity of knowledge re: asthma selfmanagement and FTP in the adolescent population

Conclusion

 Current gap in science supports the need for future research to investigate the relationship between FTP and asthma self-management in

adolescents
