

Advancing Nursing Education in China: Contributions of Foreign Expert Nurse Faculty Deborah Lindell DNP, MSN, RN, CNE, ANEF

Introduction

Challenge: During later 20th century, professional nursing in China faced diverse challenges including:

- Relative isolation of the country.
- Epidemiologic transition- from infectious disease to noncommunicable disease (NCD) & diseases of lifestyle.

Nurses responded by endeavoring to:

- Advance nursing education and practice
- Engage in scholarship
- Advocate for social policy development.

Overall problem: Chinese nursing lacked capacity of qualified nurse educators, clinicians, and researchers to implement change in nursing education and scholarship. Specific problem: Wuhan University (Hubei Province) aimed to bring nursing education into the 21st century. Purpose: Foreign expert nursing faculty will assist to:

- 1) Reform and/or implement the education programs (BSN, Masters, PhD),
- 2) Build capacity of faculty & students,
- 3) Support development of practicing professional nurses. **2002** Wuhan University partnered with Project Hope & HOPE SON endowed by Dr. C. J. Huang.

Activities of Foreign Expert Faculty

- From US, Japan, Australia & other countries (see box)
- Teach all graduate nursing-focused courses 2003-present
- Consult on curriculum development.
- Promote & model expansion of nursing roles in mental-behavioral health, management, gerontology, public health, home care, disaster preparedness (via academic courses & CE workshops)
- Mentor masters' students' research & student/faculty scholarship.
- Facilitate students' to improve English –speak/read/write
- Teach core concepts & skills; facilitate students and faculty to apply them to Chinese culture, health system & nursing practice.
- Dialogue about strategies & processes for advancing nursing profession in China.
- Model best-practice teaching-learning strategies & communitycampus collaboration.
- Presentations to nurses in hospitals & education programs.





Results-Outcomes

Collaboration- Students & faculty welcoming & enthusiastic to collaborate to advance education, practice & scholarship in China. **Wuhan University HOPE School Nursing** (source Project HOPE-2016)

- 26 full-time faculty (10-Ph.D.degrees &16-Master's degrees)
- 36 part-time teaching faculty
- Graduates 746 students (6-Ph.D. degrees;146-master's)
- Current enrollment: 259 BSN, 48 masters students, 6 PhD)
- > 5,000 continuing education students nationwide.

Publications- 66 by students & foreign faculty (9/2017, PubMed)
SON faculty- increased independence in curriculum development, scholarship, engaged teaching/learning, clinical practice.
Increased capacity and scope of roles of practicing nurses.
Graduates & faculty enrolled in PhD programs -China & abroad.
HOPE SON graduates leading change to expand nursing roles & advance nursing practice & health care throughout China.
HOPE SON is viewed as "one of the preeminent centers of nursing education in China"





Challenges

- Blending theory & practices from the west overlaid culturally-entrenched educational ideas → implications & risks to future nursing practice capacity building.
- **Differing** perceptions, values, goals & outcomes → challenges in embedding critical scholarship within unique Chinese traditions & circumstances
- Tailoring curriculum appropriately & safely to views of nursing, health, health care, policy, & ethics in China.
- Differences in national & international publication standards.
- Understanding University SON curricula, schedules, policies & processes.
- Coordination among multiple foreign & WU faculty

Recommendations

- Foreign faculty experts can be one effective strategy for other countries seeking to advance nursing practice through reinventing education.
- Identify mutually-developed, shared goals
- Incorporate principles of change and culturally-relevant practice. Expect challenges.
- Build on our strengths and shared similarities/values
- Recognize change in practice takes time
- **Establish** mechanisms to promote coordination, collaboration, & communication.
